Faith Education Funding Available—APPLY NOW!

Parishes may now start applying for Parish Religious Education Program (PREP) grants and students may apply for Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) grants and college scholarships.

Does your parish desire to provide a more dynamic religious education experience?

Parish Religious Education Program (PREP) grants provide support for religious education staff to attend the Religious Education Congress in Los Angeles, a stipend for volunteer RE coordinators, and support for their RE program. Applications can be found on our website at https://cwcatholicfoundation.org/PREP. **Deadline is May 30**.

Do you know someone that would like to send their child to a Catholic school?

TAP grants provide tuition assistance for children to attend one of the eight Catholic schools in Central Washington. Current TAP students may apply for a renewal through April 15. New students may apply from April 1 through June 1. Contact your school TAP Coordinator for information about the new online application process.

Looking for college scholarships?

The Central Washington Catholic Foundation offers three scholarships for college students: the John Rodriguez-Kranz Memorial Scholarship for a graduating senior of A. C. Davis High School in Yakima, the Mary Ellen Chott-Mahre Scholarship for a student attending a Catholic college, and the Celebration of Faith Scholarship for students attending Catholic colleges or universities. Applications are available at https://cwcatholicfoundation.org/collegescholarships. Deadline is April 1.

The St. Joseph in White Salmon Confirmation group will once again travel to St. Andre Bessette Catholic Church in downtown Portland, OR to participate in an immersion retreat. They will assist in multiple soup kitchens, tour the area, and learn about the services available to the homeless.





Our Lady of Lourdes in Selah had a great VBS program in 2016 with a theme of the History of Jesus. Daily themes included Moses, David, the Birth of Jesus, the Last Supper, and the Resurrection of Jesus. Three teenagers provided assistance, involving the kids in skits, songs, and crafts.

Understanding that parents are the first teachers in passing on the faith, St. Joseph Parish in Yakima utilizes their team of 40 volunteer catechists to provide both parents and children with the same lessons each week. The program has brought families together and it has built a strong parish community.
