Educator Remembers Student, Community Gives in Her Name

Principal at St. Rose of Lima in Ephrata, WA It all began nine years ago on a December day when a tiny, newborn baby girl was brought to St. Rose School for "show and tell" for the kindergarten class by her big sister, Courtney. Courtney could not have been prouder of her new baby sister; that was my first introduction to Samantha. She was so adorable. I look back now and I remember how all those kindergartners were waiting to hold Samantha.

Just three short years later, Samantha found her way back into that very same classroom as a three-year old preschooler. She was a big girl then, coming to school with her sister.

In preschool Samantha was diagnosed with cancer. I recall visiting her at Children's Hospital after her surgery. She was not feeling well, but adamant to do things for herself. "I can do it myself," Samantha said as she was getting back into her bed. Yes, Samantha was determined.

Wherever there was Samantha, there was her best friend and cousin, Emma. They were like two peas in a pod. They would often be wearing matching outfits like



identical twins. In the lunchroom, Samantha and Emma always sat at the same spot and nobody better be sitting there. Samantha's illness did not seem to slow her down. Samantha walked to school most of the time. The school rule is for those students that walk, ride bikes or are brought to school by car should not arrive before 8:10 a.m. This year Samantha didn't arrive at 8:00 but at 10 minutes to eight. Her backpack was always first in line and she enjoyed sitting on the boy's laps.

Samantha was the one with the illness, yet you would never know it by the happy, caring and lovable person that she was. A couple of months ago I had missed a couple of days due the flu bug. When I returned, Samantha put her arm around my neck and asked me, "How are you feeling?" And here she was the one that was having leg pains and receiving radiation treatments. Samantha cared so much for others.

Samantha was full of love. She really cared about everyone and how they felt. And it showed in the way the students wanted to be around Samantha. "She was fun to be around, she loved to tell jokes, she made me laugh, she was kind, she played with everyone, she was always smiling" are some of the things that were said about Samantha by her friends at school.

We all have special thoughts of our Sammy Sunshine. Our wonderful times spent with her, the fond memories we will cherish. I recall those mornings when Samantha would arrive early at school and wait with the others in the office. As the office got crowded, I would take the kids to the gym. Samantha would usually end up sitting on my lap. We would hold hands and visit. She would tell the others to sit down or ask to see what was being passed around. Then a teacher would come on duty at 8:00 and take the kids out for 15 minutes of recess before the day began. Samantha often would remain with me. We would talk about school, her sports stuff, her family, doctor's appointments, what she was doing in class, or what Emma and she were going to do after school. I will forever treasure those moments when her hands were in mine and we sat with my arms around her. I can only imagine that she is now sitting on Jesus' lap and it is his arms around Samantha. WE LOVE YOU, SAMANTHA!
