Formerly known as the Catholic Foundation of the



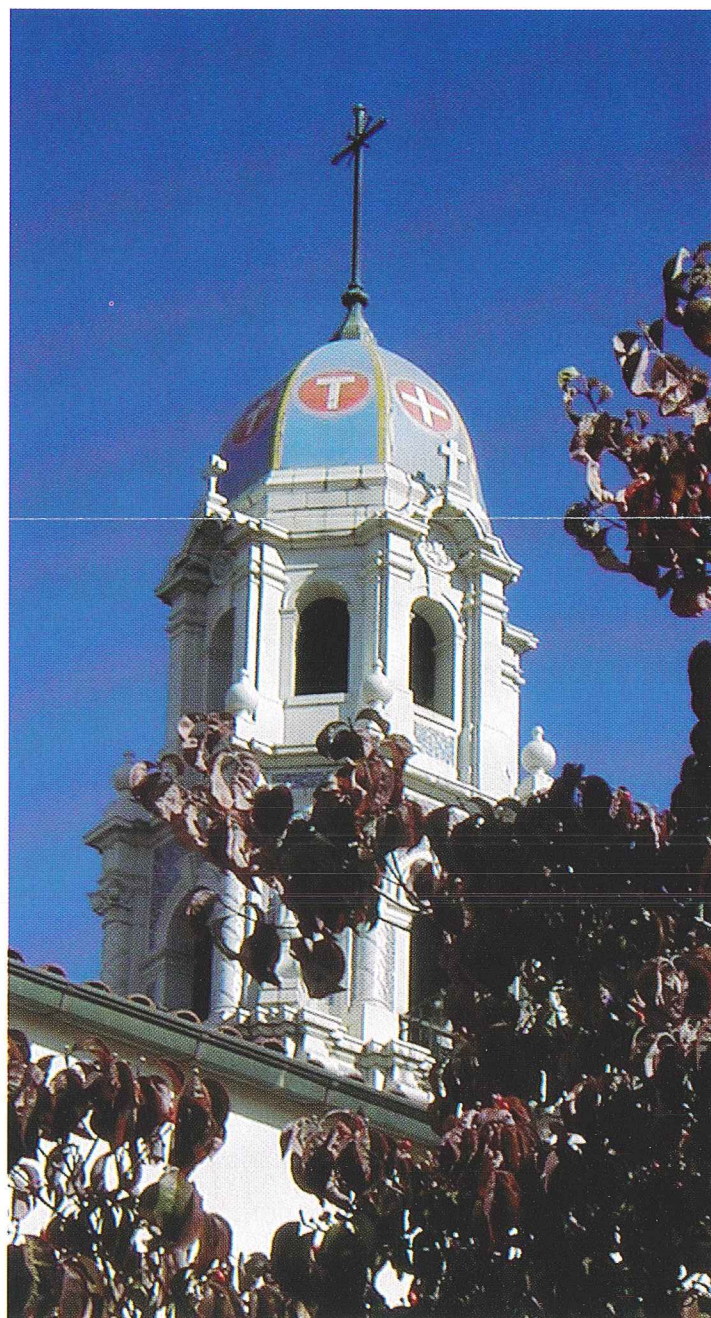
Daniel C. Fortier has become the first Chairperson of the *Central Washington Catholic Foundation*.

Diocese of Yakima, the *Central Washington Catholic Foundation* separated itself from the Diocese this past fall. At that time, all of the endowment funds of the Diocese were placed in this new nonprofit organization.

The Church laity receive a stronger

voice in raising and managing the endowment with this new separate foundation. If someone gave to the old foundation, the money remains safe and continues to support those ministries.

The new *Catholic Foundation* continues the promise for future generations. The endowment remains secure even though it is neither part of this Catholic Diocese nor under the control of the Bishop. This action safeguards future investment from any legal



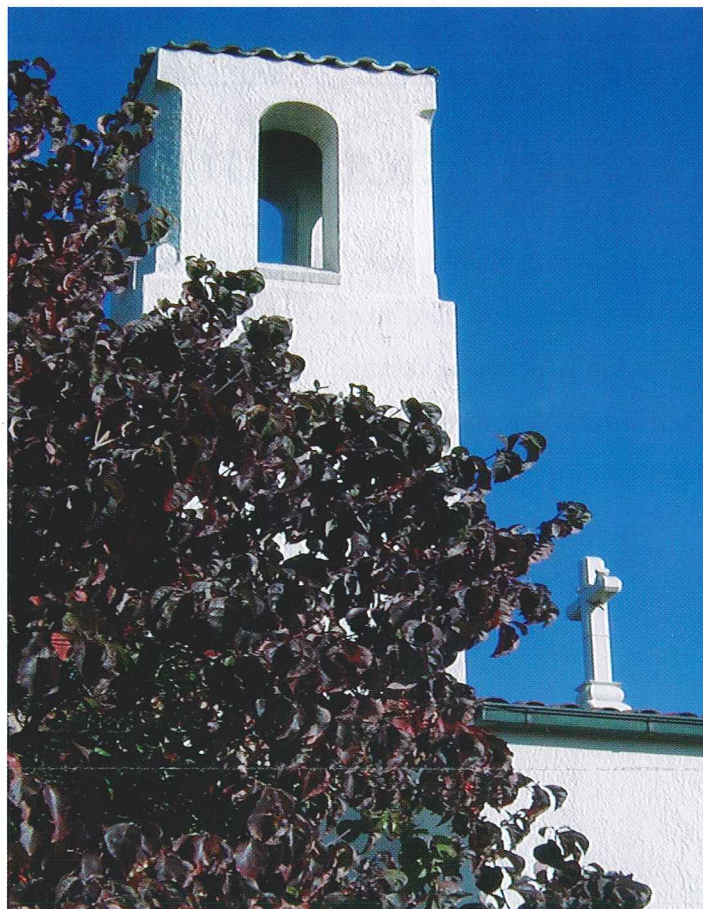

entanglements against the Diocese.

The new foundation provides essential assistance to the religious, educational and charitable activities as did the old foundation. It supports ministries for youth, the poor, the disadvantaged and the unborn. The *Central Washington Catholic Foundation* helps provide for the needs of our seminarians and priests, while aiding religious education programs in our parishes and schools.

A Board of Trustees will govern this new nonprofit organization. The first Board officers include its Chair, Daniel C. Fortier, a parishioner of Holy Family

Parish in Yakima, and Vice-Chair, Philip M. Raekes, a parishioner of St. Joseph's Parish in Kennewick.

William Wangler, Jr., a parishioner of Our Lady of Lourdes in Selah, became the first Secretary of the Board, and Rev. Samuel P. Bellino, S.J., a Jesuit living at St. Paul's Cathedral and Director of Planned Giving for the Diocese, accepted the position as Treasurer / Executive Director. All Trustee positions are voluntary.
