In Second Year Foundation Awarded Over \$81,000 To Grant Recipients

In a changing economy and through the uncertainty of our country's presidential race, the *Central Washington Catholic Foundation* completed its second year. The Foundation continues to show growth in a volatile market.

In our last fiscal year ending June 30, 2004, our Foundation gave out \$81,276 in grant money. Catholic Education received the largest portion with over 84% of all grants.

We thank you for your commitment to our mission of service. You represent the future of Catholic communities in Central Washington. Without your help, we could not achieve our lofty goal of philanthropic works.

Our steady progression corresponds to the valiant work of our experienced Board of Trustees. Our Trustees held their second annual fall retreat in Chelan, WA. Durante su Segundo Año, la Fundación otorgó más de \$81,000.00 de Subvenciones







St. Paul Cathedral School Provides Sound Education For 90 Years

Founded in 1914 on the principle of providing a sound ducation within a Christian framework, St. Paul Cathedral School continues to carry out its mission through the evolution of oday's Catholic Church in the United States. St. Paul Cathedral School strives to be a unique Christian educational community listinguished by the pursuit of truth, the cultivation of religious ralues and ideals, and the development of academic skills as a neans of realizing human potential. These standards of Christian ducation have worked well for St. Paul Cathedral School for over 90 years.

Today, St. Paul Cathedral School has over 300 students nrolled in its Early Childhood Education Program through the ighth grade. Each of these students has an important role in our ommunity as well as the community in which he or she lives. They are taught academic excellence, leadership skills, Christian ehavior toward others and moral values throughout the urriculum, religious classes and community projects. Our goal is for each of our students to enrich his or her community, as God, with the help of St. Paul Cathedral School, has taught him in her.

Since technology and education go hand in hand in today's teaching environment, we are extremely proud of our state of the art computer lab. Every student is taught how to utilize technology in his or her projects and homework assignments. Computers are also available in every classroom for students to use. The Gates Foundation has been instrumental in helping us upgrade our technology as well as the infrastructure of our school. This grant allows for monies to maintain the standard this year as well.


Community involvement helps our students see and assist the needs of others. The annual Thanksgiving Food Drive, run by the students, allows St. Paul Cathedral School to feed over 20 families with a full Thanksgiving meal plus more. Ms. Maryann Gamache and Mrs. Kathy Sharman teach quilting classes after school to interested students. The quilts made in this class are donated to local organizations for mothers with small infants or children. Our school is also a designated drop-off for "Coats for Kids".

The teaching staff, though they are all lay people, are strong Christians who believe in helping today's youth. Most of our teachers have degrees beyond the standard four-year teaching degree. They work continually to advance their education in order to advance the education of our students.

St. Paul Cathedral School is currently working with the PACE Program through the University of Portland. This year, two of our teachers are working on their Master's Degrees in Education while teaching at our school. This program is beneficial to the school by giving us strong Catholics who desire to be great teachers and are committed to teaching in Catholic schools. We are fortunate to have them for a period of two years while they teach and attend graduate school.

We are continually blessed with the wonderful support of our parishioners, parents, grandparents, and alumni. Throughout the years, St. Paul Cathedral School has succeeded because of their support, time and generosity.

Each year the cost of education continues to rise. St. Paul Cathedral School strives to keep tuition affordable through year-round fund-raising; i.e. the Elephant Ear Booth at the 4th of July Celebration and Central Washington State Fair, the Parking Lot at the Central Washington State Fair, three (3) different sales events (Gift Wrap, 365 Day Raffle Tickets and Cookie Dough), and our annual Mardi Gras Celebration. However, the needs always seem to outweigh the means. With your help and support, we will continue to offer Catholic education for the next 90 years and beyond.




